YEAR 7 : Term 1 Overview

"What is the Kingdom of God and what is its culture?" "How should I respond? "

Biblical Studies and Social Studies

Integrated Unit: 'Culture Carriers'

Over this term, we introduce the concept of culture as being made up of beliefs, values, customs and heritage. We look at these aspects of culture in a number of contexts, including our homes, classrooms, KingsWay School and related to different countries. We aim to embed these ideas and help them make connections between biblical concepts, themselves and the world around them. We begin the year by getting to know each other and considering the culture of KingsWay School and what rights and responsibilities they have as students of KingsWay. We consider the culture that we carry into the classroom and what kind of culture they would like to create and be a part of.

Students will hear, read and share the Gospel message; that is, how they can enter God's kingdom themselves by receiving Jesus' free gift of salvation. We will begin to establish how they could respond and grow in their understanding of what it means to be a citizen of God's Kingdom and how God's plan for us, who carry the Kingdom of God within, can share it with the world.

Students will learn about New Zealand's bicultural heritage and its multicultural landscape. For the latter part of the term, there will be a focus on the cultures of the Pacific Islands.

English:

Written Language

Students will write for a variety of purposes, including enjoyment. Students will be led

through a process of planning, drafting, editing and improving their work and some pieces will be worked through to publishing. Students will write an informative report on a personal coat of arms that they create later in the term. Year 7 also has a year-wide focus on grammar, punctuation and other important building blocks of writing which will also feature in their Home Learning.

Reading

Students will learn to enjoy and to be confident readers of material at their level. In Term 1, they will be taught specific skills to help them understand and engage with what they are reading, which will be a range of fiction and non-fiction texts. There will be specific foci on summarizing and making connections.

Visual Language

Students will use colour and symbols to create a personal coat of arms that will reflect their heritage, customs values and beliefs.

Oral Language

Students will be encouraged to interact with classmates in pairs, small groups and the whole class context. There will be informal and formal opportunities to share their ideas orally. Towards the end of the term, students will present their coat of arms with classmates with an importance placed on volume, expression, eye contact and content.

Science

We will look at why we study science and how it is used in understanding all aspects of

life that God created. We will then introduce students to safety in the laboratory, the equipment that we will be using and how to use them correctly. Students will be taught how to correctly light a Bunsen burner and then use it in an experiment.

Physical Education

Students will explore Adventure Based Learning activities and striking and fielding games that promote integrity, honesty, and active participation. The key competency foci will be Participating and Contributing and Relating to Others.

Mathematics:

Students will continue to practice and build on their knowledge and skills in the number strand, including multiplication, division, addition and subtraction using whole numbers, fractions and decimals. The strand focus this term is measurement which enables students to use number skills in practical ways.

YEAR 8 : Term 1 Overview

"How can I deepen my understanding of the Bible and His creation to gain a deeper understanding of the character of our God and His creation?

Biblical Studies:

Students will develop their love of God's Word through intentional study of scriptures. The creation narrative as set out in Genesis 1-3 gives orientation for much of the Christian story. Students will focus on the character of God and His creation through meaningful and insightful study of scripture, this will be unpacked using a great resource, The Gospel Project.

A memory verse, which is dedicated to our theme, will be discussed each week in class during Life Lab.

Social Studies:

During the first part of the term our overarching theme of "Wonders of Nature" will be explored across all of the curriculum areas. Students will explore the geographical locations of the Seven Natural Wonders discovering the history, landmarks, influential people and why it is considered a wonder. Students will be creating a travel brochure. During the second part of the term, we will begin our second unit focussing on Sustainability. Students will explore various issues related to sustainability, they will discover the impact on God's creation and focus on some practical solutions. Students will create a physical model to represent the change in a community over a hundred year period.

English:

Written Language

Incorporating the theme, 'Wonders of Nature', students will be learning about information reports and how to write them effectively. Students will learn how to use precise, topic specific language to convey meaning. During the second part of the term we will focus on Poetry. Students will learn about various forms of poetry and poetic devices. The unit will be completed by writing a poem related to the theme, "Sustainability'.

Students will be using a spelling programme, Spellzone, to support their vocabulary development.

Reading

Our objective is to encourage students to read with purpose and for enjoyment. Students will learn to skim and scan for important information, explore the intended meaning of the author/illustrator, identify the main ideas, summarise what they've read while focussing on reading with a Biblical Worldview lens. Our focus this term is using a range of skills to source information and decode a variety of texts.

Oral Language

Students will take on the role of a travel agent to present their brochure of one of the Seven Natural Wonders.

Visual Language

This is integrated with Social Studies

Science

Students will focus on what Science is and the branches of Science. We will also cover Safety in the laboratory and correct procedures when using equipment during experiments. We will then study the classification of living and non-living things, examining why this is so important in understanding all of God's wonderful creation.

Physical Education

Through the weekly PE lessons students will explore skills and strategies of belonging to a team, building positive relationships, and taking risks.

This will take place through tag games, striking and fielding games and modified team games. The key competency foci will be Participating and Contributing and Managing Self.

Mathematics:

Students will be focusing on foundational maths knowledge, skills and strategies across Number, Geometry and Problem Solving. They will be extending their thinking laterally and through inquiry where they can put maths into action. Our aim is for Year 8 students to know their basic facts and be able to recall them instantly. Students will be using Education Perfect at home and in class to support their maths learning.

YEAR 9 : Term 1 Overview

"What determines human worth and value?"

Biblical Studies:

The Psalms – 'Getting Real with God' – aiming to give students a better understanding of the character of God, and they can and should respond to Him. This understanding comes by studying the expressions of a relationship with God that are found in the Psalms. We also aim to equip students to engage directly with the Bible through the development of textual analysis skills.

Social Studies:

In a unit titled Broken Promises: We're all equal and free? Students will be taking an indepth look at the impact of colonial actions in the 18th and 19th Century, both in New Zealand and overseas, with particular focus on the Treaty of Waitangi and the Atlantic Slave Trade. They will also explore the issues of justice and personal responsibility from a biblical viewpoint.

English:

Students will be focusing on Poetry and narratives this term.

Written Language

Our major focus for the term is on writing Narratives. Students will learn how to write cohesively and coherently using the appropriate structure. They will also learn to use language features to sustain reader interest. An increasing use of complex punctuation and vocabulary will be a focus throughout the year.

Reading

A variety of poems and texts will be read and analyzed by students. Students will learn to use inference independently, and to understand the author's point of view and the main idea being expressed. They will understand how language features are used for effect in poetry and narratives, and learn how to make connections between texts. This links well with our Psalms focus.

Oral Language

Students will be involved in group and class discussions and will recite a poem of their choice to the class. They will also create a vlog as part of their Social Studies topic.

Visual Language

Students will create a Social Studies cartoon that uses visual language features to create meaning and convey purposeful ideas.

Science

The focus this term will be the Science fair projects. Students will engage on working with an experiment that finds a solution or answer to a question that they have formulated. We will be examining the scientific process and how we will use it to effectively carry a science investigation this term. We will be doing experiments so that students will get to understand how the scientific process works.

Physical Education

This term students will play a variety of international games with a focus on game strategy and the enjoyment of exploring new cultures and valuing all people. The key competency foci will be Manging Self and Relating to others.

Health and Well Being

Personal Identity, Belonging and Living in my strengths will be the Health and Wellbeing focus. Through class activities, creative projects, group work and self-reflection students will continue to understand who they are in Christ and why they are truly unique.

Through the Strength Explorers programme students will explore (and build upon from 2021) their top three strengths and how they can use these to grow as an individual, maintain healthy relationships with others and seek God's calling on their lives.

Mathematics:

The topics covered will be Whole Numbers, Integers, Fractions, Decimals and Percentages. Students will cover work on Measurement and have opportunities for problem solving and investigation.

Year 8 School Based Immunisation Programme: HPV

As a part of the Waitemata District Health Board's (WDHB) school based immunisation programme, Year 8 students (boys and girls) are offered the Human Papillomaviruses Vaccination (HPV).

Every Year 8 student will be given a form to take home; this form will need to be completed and signed by a parent or caregiver and returned to school whether consenting or non-consenting to the immunisation.

Absentee Procedures

Student Attendance Quick FAQ:

Late to school?

Student to go to the school library to sign in on the Vistab and receive a Late Arrival Slip to get into class. Signing in late requires a 1) Parent written note / email/app notification OR 2) Parent signature in person at the Student Reception OR Medical excuse provided by a Doctor.

Leaving Early?

Student to go to the school library to sign out on Vistab. (When the student returns from the appointment they have to sign back in on Vistab) Signing out early requires a 1) Parent written note / email / app notification OR 2) Parent signature in person at the Student Reception OR Medical excuse provided by a Doctor.

Feeling Sick?

Students who become sick, or injured, during school hours, must report to the Health Centre. Only when a parent or caregiver has been contacted by the Nurse or office staff, will the student be released. Students are NOT to text parents/caregivers to collect them from school, without following the correct procedures. We need to know where students are at all times. This is for safety reasons. *Medical certificates are required after 5 or more consecutive absences due to illness.*
